We have had no incident reports or medical emergencies in the past few months.

Placement numbers have been low due to some staffing issues. I have several interviews scheduled over the next couple of weeks and hope to resolve these issues. Our board of directors have approved an increase in our base rate salary and have included all of our more tenured staff to receive a comparable increase, hoping to increase our ability to hire and retain more qualified staff.

We have had multiple groups come to share activities with the kids over the past few weeks. The children love the extra attention and visits help to promote us in the community.

We are currently busy getting ready for the start of school. The school year always creates an atmosphere of excitement and anticipation.

I and three of my staff were authorized to attend the annual administrators' conference in Austin, sponsored by DFPS and other providers. It is a three day event focused on policy and procedure changes coming from legislative sessions and updates on best practices and training.

Our shelter was host to the monthly meeting of the North Texas Shelter Coalition, which includes management of all the shelters in our region and pertinent members of DFPS. There are many expected changes in the coming session of legislation that causes great concern to many of the shelters. I will of course keep Commissioners and board of directors apprised if the changes affect our operation.





General Fund Expenditure Summary October 2018 \$2,436,998.60






